

# ICES launches province-wide training program for academic researchers

The Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES) has officially launched the ICES Faculty Scholars Program on a province-wide basis. Established at ICES Western in 2013 for the faculty of Western University, the two-year, part-time learning opportunity will be open to Ontario-based academic researchers in the medical, health and social sciences.

The program aims to develop high-caliber researchers who are passionate about population health and health services research and wish to obtain an appointment as an ICES scientist.

An interactive e-learning environment enables remote faculty to fully participate in the program.

The program offers:

- **Training** in the use of Ontario's health administrative databases for research
- **Seminars** on advanced methods relevant to population health research
- Opportunities for **collaboration with experts** across the ICES network
- **Individual project mentorship** and **data analytic support** to develop and complete one or more research studies using Ontario's health administrative databases

Applications for the 2017–2019 program will be accepted until December 31, 2016.
